## CSCT Minutes

### Roll call

### Previous Items update:

- Safety Share – Bob Wilson discussed experience with a de-nitrator that needed a reevaluation when fissile liquid was collecting in a sink at 8 g/L concentration.

### Items for discussion:

- CSSG Tasking for Response to CSSG Tasking 2022-01 CSSG Guidance on Contract Transition with Regards to Criticality Safety.
  - Discussed that contract transition can lead to staff and subcontractors not being retained.
  - Bob Wilson discussed the contract transition to an EM site when the criticality safety engineers were needed for the D&D activities.

  - Doug Bowen discussed the ANS-8.19 recommendation for criticality safety to be independent of operations and that sometimes this is not achieved. As oversight we need to make sure this occurs.
  - Discussed why there is not minimum staffing for criticality safety, what do people use
    - INEL is down to three which is minimum for approvals, so they are scrambling
    - Sometimes at site criticality safety managers are not employees but are subcontractors
  - The CSSG tasking report has been finalized.
